MEDIA EQUIPMENT for your classroom



Each classroom is equipped with a desktop PC, a ceiling-mounted projector, a DVD/CD player and a sound system. The library lends additional media equipment to faculty on a 1st-come, 1st-served basis. We appreciate at least 24 hours-notice so that we can be sure the equipment is ready for you (e.g. fully charged). The loan period is typically one class period or one day. A sampling of available items:

- wireless mouse
- laser pointer
- thumb drive
- document camera on a cart
- plasma TV/DVD/laptop combo on a cart
- digital camera
- digital camcorder
- iPad /Mac digital display adapter
- microphones for use in w100, w101, auditorium, cafeteria
